Fall Leaf and Brush Pickup

The time for fall pick-up of leaves and brush is here and the Highway



Department would like to remind everyone of its schedule. Fall brush pickup will take place on Mondays, September 18th, September 25th, and October 2nd. Fall leaf pickup will take place weekly, on Mondays, beginning October 10th (Tuesday, due

to holiday) through November 13th. Please remember to put brush and leaves on the grass between the sidewalk and the road. Please, do not rake leaves or brush into the street, but keep them in the Village right of way. Leaves left in the ditches or in the road are very hard to clean up, clog the storm sewers and make the job very time-consuming. After November 13th, residents may collect leaves into large brown paper bags (NO PLASTIC) and place the bags at the curb for pickup, weather permitting. Only leaves bagged in paper leaf bags will be picked up after November 13th. Residents may also drop off brush and leaves anytime (NO PLASTIC) at the Village compost site, located next to the Village DPW garage. If you have any questions, please call the Village Office (315-673-3112).

School's Open!!!

Please watch for school children walking and remember that there are



pedestrian crossings on Main Street, as well as 20 mph speed limits in school zones and a 25 mph speed limit on First Street, a route that is heavily traveled by schoolchildren. Please slow down. Tickets will be issued for speeders. In other school-related news, the Village and

Marcellus Central School District have agreed to continue a contract that provides for three School Resource Officers, one at each of the schools in the district.

Your WWTP News

Going into the Holiday months please remember to dispose of any leftover cooking grease properly. It will help save you unneecassry stress this holiday season. By the time you're done cooking that juicy tender turkey you'll probably have a good amount of leftover fat and grease to deal with. Avoid dumping grease down your kitchen drain as it could cause your home sewer to backup. When greasy wastes wash into your plumbing system through your sink or garabage disposal, they can stick to your pipes. Avoid using garbage disposals as they don't prevent fats and oils from flowing down the drain. Grease dissolving detergents wont help either. The "hot soapy water" only serves to carry byproducts a few feet down your drain - usually somewhere between your foundation and property line. Village Residents are responsible for maintenance and repairs to their sewer lateral from their home to the sewer main. Here are the steps you can take to help prevent a clog: Pour grease into a heat-safe container and put it in the fridge - once it has solidified, toss the grease in the trash. Scrape food waste in the trash and wipe dishes and cooking utensils with a paper towel to soak up excess before you wash them. Use a basket or strainer to catch grease and throw it away afterwards.

Notify Police - Call 911

Chief of Police Bernie Podsiedlik reminds residents that it is essential that they report incidents of crime or vandalism in their neighborhoods by <u>calling 911</u>. Sometimes, residents might be calling the Police Department and because the officer is out on patrol, often listen to an



answering machine. Residents must call 911. If you are still not satisfied, please contact the Village Office during business hours, at 315-673-3112, and express your concern. The Chief also encourages residents to call the Department if they have any concerns about contractors they may employ. The Department would be happy to do background checks so as

to alleviate these concerns.

Green Gateway Pedestrian Bridge

This project is one that is ongoing, and we hope will result in an environmentally positive gateway entrance to our Village – One project involved the construction of a pedestrians-only footbridge, crossing the creek from the school property to the lower mill site, which is now owned by the Village. A pedestrian steel bridge now creates an easy and safe manner for students to cross directly from the campus to the outdoor classroom. The process which started in 2021, to acquire and install the bridge began with a request for funding from our NYS Senator John Mannion who helped secure a State and Municipal (SAM) capital project grant of \$180,000. After soil testing, design, and survey, excavation and foundation work, the installation of the bridge took place in mid-July, utilizing a crane and the many efforts of Village DPW and Town Highway workers. The bridge is one more excellent example of intermunicipal cooperation between the Village, the Town and the Marcellus School District.

Green Gateway Project

The Green Gateway Project is a continuous work in progress and one that it will continue as students return this fall. Other student improvement projects include fishing access sites in compliance with the Americans Disabilities Act, historical signs, berm plantings, and installation of bat houses.

Baltimore Ridge Development

Development continues to move along quite well, and as of this date, many building permits have been issued with construction varying on each lot. Utilities, roads and sewer infrastructure have not yet been turned over to the Village, which will probably take place this Fall.

Marcellus Health Loan Closet

Now located at the Village Hall 6 Slocombe Ave, the Loan Closet continues to be a non-profit community organization, whose objective is to equip and maintain a loan closet of articles to aid in caring for sick persons in the home, including wheelchairs, walkers, knee scooters and other items. The articles are loaned, without charge, for use in private homes of those who are residents of the Marcellus Central School District. The Marcellus Health Loan Closet welcomes new members.
